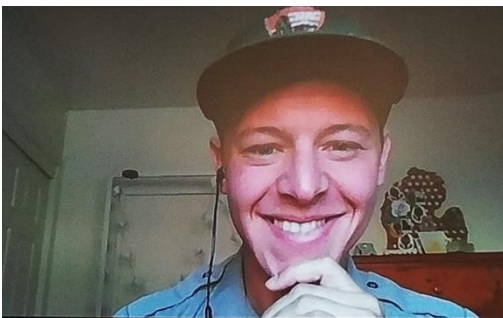

**Richard Moore, Chief of  
Interpretation  
Chris Syons, Park Ranger  
Volunteer Coordinator  
Hain Wilderness Pinnacles  
National Park**



*“Eons of wind and water, heat and frost produced the starkly angular crags and spires of today's Hain Wilderness. Situated within Pinnacles National Park, Hain Wilderness, previously called the Pinnacles Wilderness, was renamed in January, 2013 in honor of Schuyler Hain. Hain was a homesteader who led tours to Bear Valley and through the caves, advocating for preservation of the region. Hain's efforts moved Theodore Roosevelt to establish Pinnacles National Monument in 1908, which formally became a national park the same year the Wilderness was renamed.”* ([wilderness.net/visit-wilderness/?ID=461](http://wilderness.net/visit-wilderness/?ID=461))



Chief of Interpretation Richard Moore (pictured bottom left) presented an overview regarding wilderness. It all began with President B. Johnson signing the Wilderness Act of 1964, a public law that defines wilderness (i.e., natural, undeveloped, untrampled land, opportunities for solitude, unconfined recreation) and articulates prohibitions (i.e., no commercial enterprise, permanent roads, use of motor vehicles). In 1964 there were 54 original wilderness areas and presently there are 803 designated areas. California has the largest amount of wilderness acreage. The largest area is in Alaska and the smallest is Pelican Island, FL.

Richard stated that it is important for visitors to wilderness areas abide by *leaving no trace* by:

- Plan ahead and prepare,
- Travel and camp on durable surfaces,
- Dispose of waste properly,
- Leave what you find,
- Minimize campfire impacts,
- Minimize campfire impacts,

- Be considerate of other visitors.

Park Ranger Volunteer Coordinator Chris Syons (pictured top left page 1) spoke more specifically about the Hain Wilderness. He began by stating that though the Pinnacles National Park is mostly wilderness, some is not. (Picture on right)

Hain Wilderness acreage is 80% of the Park. As the map shows there are no roads running through the Hain area.

Chris reemphasized the definition of wilderness. As seen in the pictures below.
