Rosa Vivian Fernandez Covid-19 Vaccine

CEO/President of the San Benito County Health Foundation (SBCHF) and fellow Rotarian Rosa Fernandez spoke about the Covid-19 vaccine program.

SBCHF's focus is on prevention of disease and therefore the goal is to *"catch people before they have any disease and we focus on prevention and administering vaccines (flu, whopping cough, etc.)"* Now that Covid Pandemic is extremely affecting our nation and nations around the world, *"it is time to 1) distribute and 2) get it into peoples' arms. One of my colleagues reminds me that there is no value in the vaccine. The value of the vaccine is in vaccinations."*

There are two types of vaccines: Pfizer and Moderna. Both vaccines require a follow-up vaccine and are 95% effective. The more people immunized within "pods", the better the protection. *"From a public health standpoint, you really want to immunize pods."* It is noteworthy, that the vaccine antibodies do not fully take affect for approximately 2-weeks after

receiving the shot.

SBCHF has historically vaccinated its staff and Board against the Flu and other diseases. There is no exception for that of the Covid-19 immunization. Unfortunately, the lack of vaccines is causing nationwide problems in immunizing people rapidly. Now that a second strain is occurring worldwide, it is even more important to quickly vaccinate as many as possible to control the first strain.

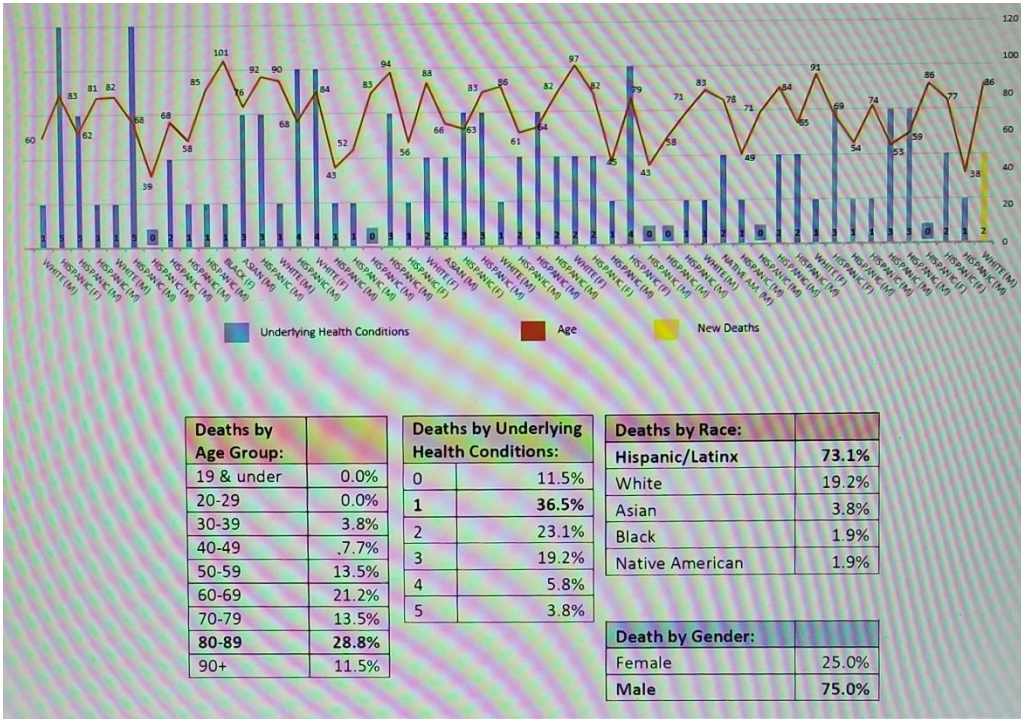

The chart to the left shows the data regarding the San Benito County deaths. It should be noted that the highest death rate has been the Hispanic/Latino population (73.1%) and males (75%). Of much urgency is the immunize of agricultural workers. According to a UCSF study, 40% of the farm workers who become ill with Covid die. Those who do not die are permanently damaged.

The chart below shows the guideline and timeline by which the SBCHF is following. Presently, the organization is beginning

Phase IB Tier 1.

It takes approximately an hour to register a person for a vaccination. To ensure a smooth and organized vaccination process, it takes about eight people.

As of January, SBCHF has received 800 vaccines and has deployed 789. The difference was caused by a vial that arrived damaged and one vial that produced 9 vaccines rather than the normal 10. Of those, 277 went to persons 65 years of age and over. Along with all the staff vaccines were as well given to health providers at the Pinnacle Urgent Care.
